A Mass of Christian Burial for Dr. Eugene W. Vogt Jr., MD, will be held at 11AM Tuesday February 7, 2012 at Saint Patrick Catholic Church Ferriday. Interment will follow at Natchez City Cemetery under the direction of Comer Funeral Home Ferriday. Dr. Vogt was born on January 1, 1924 to the union of Eugene W. and Ethel Rhorer Vogt and passed from this life on Saturday morning February 4, 2012 at Heritage Manor after an extended illness. Dr. Vogt was a 1942 graduate of Ferriday High School. Springhill College Mobile, Alabama, Emory University Atlanta, Georgia and Louisiana State University Medical School New Orleans, Louisiana; he served as intern at the Charity Hospital Shreveport. Dr. Vogt returned to Ferriday in 1948 and practiced medicine with Dr. Ratcliff and Dr. Coleman at the old Ferriday Hospital. Dr. Vogt was called in to active duty in 1951 at the Naval Hospital Portsmouth, Virginia, then transferred to the Marines at Camp Lejeune Jacksonville, North Carolina and then transferred to the Air Force serving at Barksdale Air Force Base Shreveport. Dr. Vogt served in the United States Navy, Marines and Air Force because at that time all branches of the military shared physicians. On September 20, 1948 he married his best friend Marjorie Tinsley who he had met at Charity Hospital while she was a student nurse. Mrs. Vogt become his beloved wife and devoted mother to his children. Dr. Vogt was one of the first physicians to practice at Riverland Medical Center Ferriday in 1965; he retired from practice in 1988 after 40 years as a physician in Ferriday. He was a member of Saint Patrick Catholic Church where he was a lifetime greeter and

served as collection usher. He is preceded in death by his parents; a son Robert Rhorer Vogt; grandson Michael Tinsley Vogt; granddaughter Catherine Ashley Vogt; brother Frank Vogt and sister Kitty Vogt Deprato. Survivors include his wife 63 years Marjorie T. Vogt of Ferriday; his sons Eugene ?Goo? W. Vogt III, and wife Laura and their two daughters Maggie and Melissa Vogt; Michael Tinsley Vogt and his son James Michael Vogt; Joseph Patrick Vogt Sr., and wife Merida and their children Joseph Patrick Vogt Jr., Robert Harrison Vogt, Ainsley Smith and Blake Robinson; Shannon Dennis Vogt and wife Shannon Lewis-Vogt and their children Catherine Sullivan and husband Chris, Christopher Vogt and Gavin Tinsley Vogt; his brothers Howard Vogt and wife Betty Jane, Barry Vogt also survived by 4 great grandchildren.
